

Dr. Carlos Gonzalez Quesada



Dr. Quesada is a member of the GIVE mHealth Steering Committee. He graduated summa cum laude Universidad De La Salle's School of Medicine in Mexico City in 2007. After completing his medical degree, Dr. Quesada worked as a predoctoral and postdoctoral fellow at Baylor College of Medicine and Albert Einstein College of medicine, respectively, conducting research on the mechanisms of ischemic heart disease, hypertension, diabetes and obesity. Dr. Quesada received an M.P.H. degree from the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health in 2015.

As a Global Health Equity Resident, Dr. Quesada worked under the mentorship of Felicia Knaul at the Harvard Global Equity Initiative office supporting projects related to the Global Task Force on Expanded Access to Cancer Care and Control in developing countries. He also co-founded Global Poverty Project 2030, a global initiative to harness and combine the knowledge and expertise of young professionals to support the United Nations post-2015 global development agenda and eradicate extreme poverty by 2030. He also worked with the Mexican Ministry of Health and the National Institute of Cardiology to shape policies related to the control of noncommunicable diseases in underserved populations. Dr. Quesada also worked with the World Heart Federation to develop global policies

aimed to the control of rheumatic heart disease in developing countries. Furthermore, he continued working as the editor-in-chief of Guia EXARMED, an educational platform oriented to train medical students and general practitioners in Mexico and Latin America.

After graduation, Dr. Quesada will become a cardiology fellow at the Ronald Reagan UCLA Medical Center and will continue working with the Mexican Ministry of Health and the World Heart Federation.
