

Reginald Mbawuike



Reginald Mbawuike, is a Hutchins Information Technology Fellow at Harvard's Faculty of Arts and Sciences and was one of the first five directors of the International Economic Alliance –where he served for five years. In his most recent role with the mental health branch of MassHealth, he provided health research analysis using big data to assess the pediatric visits with psychiatric participation for 95% of the pediatric visits in Massachusetts. This monthly, quarterly, and annual data analytics report was received by the Massachusetts Department of Mental Health for inpatient and outpatient evaluation.

Reginald was the innovator of the app prototype used by the GIVE mHealth Program for its global health equity pilot. As CEO Research Associate to Professor Michael Porter –the author of the bestseller “Redefining Healthcare” at Harvard Business School, Reginald was responsible for market analysis for new multi-billion dollar per-annum CEOs. The 12 CEOs increased revenues by \$3.2 billion the following year. He also served as the Research Associate to Dr. Henry Louis Gates.

Reginald was the Institutional Associate for Investing and Managing in Emerging Markets, Strategy, Real Asset Property Management, The Entrepreneurial Manager, and Finance at Harvard Business School. He drafted the tax-free clause of the African Growth & Opportunities Act that was later passed as law by the Congress, Senate, and President of the United States. He has been part of several start-ups

in his years in Silicon Valley and prior. Along with his studies at Harvard University he possesses a degree from Babson College.
